Description

Liberty Classical Academy is a K-12 University Model School serving 112 students on the Western Slope of Colorado. The high school curriculum integrates a solid Christian worldview with Classical Philosophy based on the Trivium model of Grammar, Logic, and Rhetoric stages. The University Model integrates home and classroom learning environments to prepare students for college or career. Students attend two days of classroom instruction.

GPA Calculation

All classes from ninth grade onward are included in the GPA calculation. Twenty-five credits are required for graduation, including two years of high school level Latin. Three 40-hour projects and one 60-hour project, participation in four musical theater productions, and a semester of service learning are also required.

Theater Program

The theater production at Liberty Classical Academy is considered an integral part of raising leaders for tomorrow. All students participate in a rigorous and cooperative musical production each year, in which every student is required to play a role on stage. This prepares our students to articulate ideas to an audience, and builds confidence and character. By the time each student graduates, they will have played at least one speaking role.

Forty Hour Projects

All high school students complete a forty hour project each year, combining their interests and strengths with the Classical model. Seniors must complete a sixty hour capstone project that represents a culmination of their high school learning. Recent examples of projects include a historically accurate crossbow, translation of modern novel into Shakespearean language, and construction of a personal computer.
